First Holy Communion Trivia

Did you know?

- First Holy Communion is the common name for a person's first reception of the sacrament of the Eucharist.
- A child must be baptised before he/she can have their First Holy Communion.
- In Europe, the tradition is that the Communion child receives favours, treats wrapped in Italian fabric, at their Communion breakfast and these can include sugared almonds or chocolate.
- In Ireland, approximately 70,000 kids make their communion every year.*
- Holy Communion clothes for girls are white as they symbolise purity.
- In many countries boys wear military uniforms.
- Historically, Communion dresses were worn short but over the years, the hemlines have dropped dramatically to resemble mini wedding dresses.
- Over the past decade, the occasion has turned from a low key religious appreciation to a full blown party for the kids with spray tans, limousines and €50 notes in envelopes.
- The average amount spent by parents in Ireland on a First Holy Communion outfit is €500 for a girl and €250 for a boy. Across the world, many families hand down the Holy Communion outfits to the younger siblings.
